Marcia S. Smith is the founder and editor of SpacePolicyOnline.com [Twitter: @SpcPlcyOnline] [facebook.com/spacepolicyonline/] and president of the Space and Technology Policy Group, LLC, specializing in policy analysis of civil, military and commercial space programs.

Ms. Smith has more than four decades of experience in space policy. Before starting her own company and website in 2009, she was Director of the Space Studies Board (2006-2009) at the National Research Council (NRC), and additionally Director of the NRC's Aeronautics and Space Engineering Board (2007-2009). The NRC is the operating arm of The National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, a non-profit organization in Washington, D.C. that provides expert advice to the nation on science, engineering and health.

Previously, Ms. Smith was a senior level specialist in aerospace and telecommunications policy at the Congressional Research Service (CRS), Library of Congress, Washington, D.C. (1975-2006). CRS provides objective, non-partisan research and analysis exclusively for the Members and committees of the U.S. Congress. Ms. Smith specialized in U.S. and foreign military and civilian space activities, as well as other science and technology policy issues (including telecommunications and nuclear energy). She took a one year leave of absence from 1985-1986 to serve as Executive Director of the U.S. National Commission on Space. The Commission was created by Congress and its members appointed by President Reagan to develop long term (50 year) goals for the civilian space program. The results were published in the report *Pioneering the Space Frontier* (Bantam Books). Before joining CRS (1973-1975), she worked in the Washington Office of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (then headquartered in New York). A graduate of Syracuse University, Ms. Smith is the author or co-author of more than 220 reports and articles on space, nuclear energy, and telecommunications (not including articles and reports on SpacePolicyOnline.com). Ms. Smith is –
